# Literary/Philosophical Movement Research Project Assignment

# Your Task:

Design and implement a **15-20 minute** presentation/lesson to teach your classmates about your assigned literary/philosophical movement.

# The Process:

- 1. Use at least **5** authoritative sources, a combination of MLWGS subscription databases (JSTOR, *World History in Context, Virtual Reference Library,* etc...) and open source internet resources to research your literary/philosophical movement and create your lesson
- 2. With your group, decide on a plan to teach your classmates
  - a. the basic belief system underlying your assigned movement
  - b. ways in which these ideas relate to Kafka's *Metamorphosis* and other shared texts we have read this year or last year
  - c. Iconic examples of your assigned movement in art
  - d. Iconic examples of your assigned movement in music
  - e. Any social, political, or historical contexts that heavily inform your movement
- 3. Create your **GS Presentation with MLA Notes Outline**, handouts, and activities that your group will use to teach your movement
- 4. Post your presentation on Goggle Classroom assignment link
- 5. Teach your lesson and receive feedback from your peers and teacher

# Each Lesson Must Incorporate:

- GS Presentation with MLA Outline in Notes Section + Works Cited Page
- Visual & Audio representations of your movement in art and music
- Basic belief system underlying your movement
- Social, political, and historical contexts closely associated with your movement
- An activity to engage your peers (worksheet, discussion, interactive quiz, etc...)
- Logical opening and closing
